The number of children served annually by the CAC had grown to over 600. The search began for a new space that could accommodate the growing need.



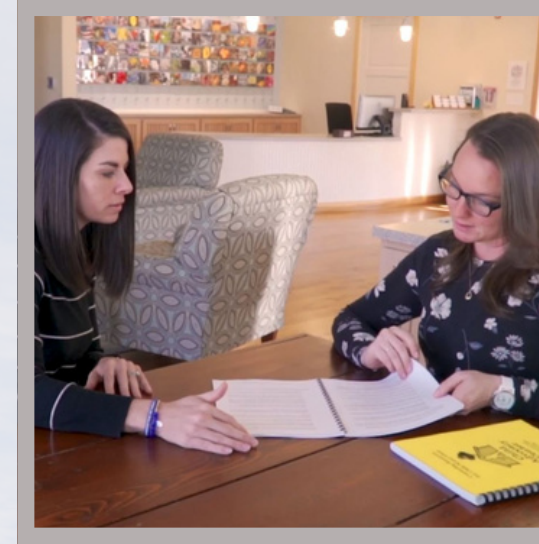
2011

The new location in University Place opened its doors with 8 staff members.



2012

The CAC expanded on-site mental health services through an increased collaboration with Project SAFE and a new partnership with Lutheran Family Services.



2015

The CAC launched a Training & Prevention Program to educate the community on child abuse. To date, approximately 20,000 individuals have participated in a training.



2020

Now serving over 1200 children per year, The CAC began the silent phase of a \$5.2 million Capital Campaign.

2021

The CAC is breaking ground to give the children we serve Room to Heal.



1998

The Child Advocacy Center opened its doors in Antelope Park, serving 36 children in the first year.



2009

Dan & Cara Whitney pledged a gift of \$1 million, allowing the CAC to break ground on a new building.



2012

LB 993 was passed, mandating CAC utilization for children who are 3 to 18 years of age and are alleged to be victims of abuse.



2014

The CAC opened satellite offices in York and Nebraska City (now Auburn) to better serve rural families.



2018

The CAC began serving child victims of sex-trafficking. The number of victims has grown 350% in 3 years.
